

## **October 8-14. Sunday of the Holy Fathers of the Seventh Ecumenical Council.**

### **Readings at Vespers:**

(1) The Reading is from Genesis. *[14:14-20]*

Now when Abram heard that Lot his nephew had been taken captive, he counted his own home-born servants, three hundred and eighteen, and pursued the enemy as far as Dan. And he fell upon them by night, he and his servants, and attacked them and pursued them as far as Hobal, which is on the left of Damascus. And he brought back all the cavalry of Sodom, and he brought back Lot his nephew and all his goods and the women and the people. And the king of Sodom came out to meet him, after his return from the slaughter of Hodologomor and the kings with him, to the valley of Savi; this was the plain of kings. And Melchizedek, king of Salem, brought out bread and wine; he was Priest of God Most High. And he blessed Abram and said: "Blessed is Abram by God Most High, who created the heaven and the earth. And blessed is God is Most High, who has delivered your enemies into your hand."

(2) The Reading is from Deuteronomy. *[1:8 - 11 & 15 - 17b]*

In those days, Moses said to the children of Israel: " 'See, I have delivered the land before you; go in and inherit the land which I swore to your fathers, to Abraham and to Isaac and to Jacob, to give it to them and to their seed after them.' And I spoke to you at that time saying: 'I shall not be able to bear you alone.' The Lord our God has multiplied you, and behold, you are to-day as the stars of heaven in multitude. May the Lord, the God of our fathers, multiply you a thousand times more than you are, and may he bless you, as he said to you. And I took from you wise and understanding and prudent men, and I set them to rule over you, captains of thousands and hundreds and fifties and tens, and recorders for your judges. And I commanded your judges at that time, saying: 'Administer justice between your brethren, and judge rightly between a man and his brother and the stranger who lives with him. You shall not have respect to persons in judging. You shall hear the small as well as the great. You shall not shrink before any man's person; for the judgement is God's.' "

(3) The Reading is from Deuteronomy. *[10:14 - 21]*

In those days, Moses said to the children of Israel: “Behold the heaven and the highest heaven belong to the Lord your God, the earth and all that is in it. Moreover the Lord preferred your fathers, to love them; and he chose their seed after them, you above all nations, as it is at this day. So circumcise the hardness of your heart and do not be stiff necked. For the Lord our God is God of gods and Lord of lords, the great God, mighty and to be feared, who shows no partiality, who takes no bribe. He executes judgement for the stranger, the orphan and the widow; and loves the stranger, giving him food and clothing. You also shall love the stranger, for you were strangers in Egypt. You shall fear the Lord your God and serve him, and you shall hold fast to him, and take oaths in his name. He is your boast, and he is your God, who has done for you the great and glorious things which your eyes have seen.”
